

3. ALL INDIA QUOTA

3.1 Quota for Veterinary Council of India (VCI) for BVSc & AH

FIFTEEN PER CENT (15%) OF THE TOTAL NUMBER OF SEATS in BVSc & AH degree is reserved for the candidates selected by the Veterinary Council of India, New Delhi (for further details, contact VCI).

3.2 Quota for Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) for BTech (Food Technology and Dairy Technology)

FIFTEEN PER CENT (15%) OF THE TOTAL NUMBER OF SEATS in BTech (Food Technology and Dairy Technology) degree is reserved for the candidates selected by the ICAR, New Delhi (for further details, contact ICAR).

4. TAMIL NADU STATE QUOTA 4.1 ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

Candidates satisfying the eligibility conditions given below as on the last date of submission of online application are eligible to apply. **Passing the qualifying examination or changing the religion after the last date of submission of online application shall not be considered.**

4.1.1 NATIVITY

- Candidates should be an Indian Citizen and Native of Tamil Nadu State.
- Candidates who have passed VIII, IX, X, XI and XII Std. in Tamil Nadu are eligible to apply. They need not submit Nativity Certificate.
- The candidates native of Tamil Nadu who have passed any of the VIII, IX, X, XI and XII Std. or their equivalent examinations from schools situated outside Tamil Nadu should enclose Nativity Certificate as given in Annexure I, Page No.61. The nativity certificate should have the mandatory statement that "the Applicant is a native of the state of Tamil Nadu by birth".
- Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) / Persons of Indian Origin (PIO): Candidates of OCI / PIO card holders and Nativity of Tamil Nadu shall be permitted in TANUVAS counseling under the Open Category (OC). This will not apply to the candidates of OCI/PIO card holders who are born in a foreign country after 04.03.2021 (*vide* GO.MS. No. 221, of Higher Education (J2) Department, Government of Tamil Nadu, dated 28.07.2023).

4.1.2 AGE LIMIT

4.1.3 STREAM OF EDUCATION

BVSc & AH

The candidates who studied in the Academic Stream (Physics, Chemistry and Biology or Botany and Zoology) and in the Vocational Stream (Biology and Agricultural Practices / Poultry / Dairying) are eligible for applying BVSc & AH degree programme.

BTech (Food Technology / Poultry Technology / Dairy Technology)

For BTech degree programme, only candidates who studied in the Academic Stream (Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and Biology) are eligible.

Vocational Stream Candidates for Tamil Nadu State

FIVE PER CENT (5%) OF THE TOTAL NUMBER OF SEATS in BVSc & AH is reserved for the candidates studied under Vocational Stream of HSC of Tamil Nadu State (candidates studied in Vocational Stream of Board Examination other than Tamil Nadu are not eligible to apply). The candidates from Vocational Stream shall be considered for admission to BVSc & AH degree programme only (not eligible for BTech degree programme) against the seats reserved for them and they will not be considered under other categories.

4.1.4 QUALIFYING EXAMINATIONS AND MINIMUM MARKS

- A pass in the Higher Secondary Course (10+2) / CBSE / any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto and fulfilling the following requirements are mandatory.
- In addition, for those candidates who have appeared HSC Examination of Tamil Nadu State Board from March 2019, a pass in 11th standard examination is mandatory (G.O. Ms. No. 195, School Education Dept., dated 14.09.2018 of the Government of Tamil Nadu).
- The candidates who have passed 10+2 from open school or as private candidates shall not be eligible. Further, the study of biology as an additional subject at 10+2 level also shall not be permissible.
- Only academic qualification examination marks secured by the candidate will be considered for the aggregate mark calculation. Grace marks for co-curricular / extracurricular activities will not be considered.

4.1.5 NUMBER OF ATTEMPTS

The maximum number of attempts made for passing the qualifying examination is limited to **THREE for SC / SCA / ST candidates and TWO for other candidates.**

THE IMPROVEMENT MARKS IN HSC OR EQUIVALENT EXAMINATION OF ANY YEAR INCLUDING OTHER STATE CANDIDATE WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED (GO. MS. No. 184 HE(J2) Dept. dated 9.6.2005 and GO. (St) No. 143 HE (J2) Dept. dated 6.5.2008).

Selection shall be made for different community categories, following the rules of reservation of the Government of Tamil Nadu. The percentages of reservation available for different community categories are as follows:

Government Orders for communal Reservation

- Tamil Nadu Ordinance No. 4 of 2007 published in the Tamil Nadu Government Gazette Extraordinary No. 262 dt. 15.09.2007 provides for reservation in respect of annual permitted strength in each branch or faculty for admission into educational institutions in the State including private educational institutions.
- For the Backward Class Muslims, it shall be three and a half per cent within the thirty per cent reservation for Backward Class as provided in the 1994 Act and in 2006 Act.
- G.O. Ms. No. 50, Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare (TD-2) 29.04.2009. (16% seat offered to Arunthathiyars within the seats reserved for scheduled castes for admission in Educational Institutions).
- G.O. Ms. No.28 dated 06.04.2015 [Inclusion of Transgender / Eunuch (Thirunangai / Aravani) in the list of Most Backward Classes]

The list of communities eligible to compete against the reserved quota is furnished in **Appendix-I (List of Communities)** in **Page No 37**.

Tamil Nadu native candidates alone will be considered for communal reservation. The community recorded in the certificate of candidates native of Tamil Nadu should appear in the list of communities approved by the Government of Tamil Nadu.

- The applicants from Tamil Nadu State should have obtained a permanent community certificate in permanent card format / electronic form / digitally signed e-certificate only from the authorities given above on or before the last date prescribed for submission of online application. Community certificates obtained after the last date prescribed for submission of online applications will not be considered.
- Community certificates obtained from other states will not be considered for communal reservation, but will be considered as open category (OC) only if he / she fulfills the eligibility norms otherwise.
- For communities linked with Districts, the candidates should obtain their community certificate in the respective district except the communities mentioned in G.O. (Ms) No. 95 BC, MBC & Minorities Welfare Department dated 28.10.2009. Such of those community certificates obtained on or after 28.10.2009 will be considered. Community certificate obtained from other than the respective district will not be considered.
- Candidates who have not produced the Community Certificate in the form of Permanent Community Certificate [Card] or electronic form / digitally signed e-certificate at the time of verification of original certificates, their application will be treated under "Open Competition (OC)". The candidate is further informed that in the event of such a decision, the eligibility conditions and norms prescribed for OC will be applicable for such candidates and if such candidates do not satisfy the norms of OC, their applications are liable to be rejected. No correspondence in this connection will be entertained.
- If a candidate submits a false / fabricated Community Certificate or Nativity Certificate or any other Certificate and found at a later point during the course of the study, it will result in expulsion of the candidate from the course and also legal proceedings / criminal action will be initiated against the candidate and their parents as per the provisions of law.

4.3 SPECIAL CATEGORIES

Seats are reserved for special categories such as Differently-abled, Sports Persons and Children of Ex-servicemen as detailed below. The seats earmarked for the special categories will be allotted following the horizontal reservation. The seats will be allotted as per the rank in the concerned special category and accordingly, those seats will be deducted in concerned community. If adequate number of eligible candidates is not available under special category, then the earmarked unfilled seats will be reverted back to the General category.

4.3.1 Differently-abled [BVSc & AH and BTech (FT/PT/DT)]

Five per cent (5%) of the total number of seats is reserved for the Differently abled candidates / Persons with Benchmark Disabilities as per The Gazette of India-Extraordinary. Part III-Section 4. No.286 published on 08.07.2016, Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers welfare (Department of Animal Husbandry, Dairying and Fisheries) (VETERINARY COUNCIL OF INDIA) Notification, F. No. 12-5/2015-VCI-Part III-Admission to the Bachelor of Veterinary Science and Animal Husbandry degree course-under Section 7(Selection of Students) serial no.10 and as per Lr. No. 11404/AH6/2017-2 Dated: 16.10.2017 of the AHD&F (AH6) Dept., Govt. of Tamil Nadu and G.O (D) No.947, Health and Family Welfare Dept., dated 06.06.2019 and Right of Persons with Disability Act, 2016).

Section 7. Selection of Students

Serial. No.10 - A candidate shall not be allowed admission to the Bachelor of Veterinary Science and Animal Husbandry degree course including those admitted under 15% reserved quota of the Veterinary Council of India if he or she suffers the following disabilities, namely: -:

- a) disability of total body including disability of chest or spine more than 50%,
- b) disability of lower limb of more than 50%,
- c) disability of upper limb,
- d) visually handicapped candidates and those with hearing disability,
- e) candidates with progressive diseases like myopathies etc.
- f) disabilities which otherwise would interfere in the performance of the duties of a veterinarian.

THIS RESERVATION IS PROVIDED ONLY FOR THE CATEGORY OF LOCOMOTOR DISORDERS OF LOWER LIMBS RANGING FROM 40% TO 80%. ANY OTHER DISABILITY WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED.

Candidates with less than 40% disabilities are NOT ELIGIBLE for reservation, provided that the candidates are eligible to apply for Undergraduate Degree

Programmes of TANUVAS under general category. However, such candidates have to **submit a physical fitness certificate**. The presence of significant Locomotor Disability with or without any other significant disability – such as visual or hearing–speech or learning *etc.* which will make it difficult for the candidate to pursue and complete the course satisfactorily and may significantly increase the risk to the candidate – may be declared **INELIGIBLE** for admission.

Other conditions for admission to the degree programmes are applicable as in the case of General Category. The candidates seeking admission under this special category are required to produce a certificate obtained from the authorized District Medical Board of the area concerned constituted for the purpose of assessing the nature and the extent of physical disability in the format (Annexure- II in Page No. 62) prescribed in this Prospectus. The certificate must have been obtained within THREE MONTHS PRIOR to submitting the application for seeking admission under this category. If the candidate has obtained the medical certificate earlier / failed to submit the Medical Certificate, then their application will be rejected under this special category.

The medical certificate received without the specific recommendation of the District Medical Board will not be considered for selection under this special category. The candidate appearing for counselling will be physically examined by the medical officer/board specifically constituted for the purpose and **whose decision on eligibility is final**. The candidates who have previously applied for UG degree programmes under the differently-abled category and made ineligible by the Medical Board are not eligible to apply under this category. Such applications will be summarily rejected. The selected differently-abled candidates of Tamil Nadu will be exempted from paying tuition fees and special fees of the total college fees prescribed by the University.

4.3.2 Sports

The candidates of academic stream who wish to apply for BVSc & AH / BTech (Food Technology / Poultry Technology / Dairy Technology) degree programme under **sports quota should upload copy(ies) of the certificate(s)** for having taken part in Sports Meet / Tournaments / Competitions and secured I, II or III place and / or participated in individual events / team games at the International / National / State / Regional / District level along with the details of Sports Certificates. (Annexure III) The detailed guidelines are mentioned in Appendix - II, Page No. 48 (*Reference: Rc. No.1618-1/SS-2/2024, Dt 29.05.2024*).

4.3.3 Children of Ex-Servicemen

The candidates from Academic Stream of the qualifying examination who wish to apply for BVSc & AH / BTech (Food Technology / Poultry Technology / Dairy Technology) degree program under Children of Ex-Servicemen Quota should produce a certificate in the format of **Annexure- IV in Page No. 64** from the Assistant Director of Ex-Servicemen Welfare Board of the District concerned that his / her father is an Ex-Serviceman and has served in the Armed Forces.

4.3.4 Government School Students (7.5% seats on preferential basis)

The "Tamil Nadu admission to Undergraduate Professional Courses on Preferential basis to students of Government Schools Act, 2021" (Act No. 14 of 2021) provides 7.5% seats on preferential basis (Horizontal reservation in each category of vertical reservation followed in the state of Tamil Nadu without affecting the existing 69% of rule of reservation in force) to the students who have studied from 6th to 12th standard in the State Government schools, in admission. The candidates from Academic Stream of the qualifying examination who wish to apply for BVSc & AH / BTech (Food Technology / Poultry Technology / Dairy Technology) degree programme under Government schools' student category should correctly mention the unique EMIS number (Educational Management Information System) as issued by the Government of Tamil Nadu (School Education Department) in Online application, which will be verified.

Seats include all the seats in BVSc & AH and BTech courses excluding the seats reserved for all India quota;

- "Government schools" mean and include Government schools, Corporation schools, Municipal schools, Panchayat Union schools, Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare schools, Kallar Reclamation schools, Forest Department schools and other schools managed by Government departments.
- Student studied in Government schools shall also be entitled to compete for the Government seats, other than those set apart on preferential basis, along with the students who studied in private school.
- Admission of Students studied in Government schools on preferential basis shall be made by following the reservation as per the law in force.
- Notwithstanding anything contained in above, where adequate numbers of students studied in Government schools are not available for admission to the

seats set apart on preferential basis, such unfilled seats shall be filled up with the students who studied in private schools".

The seat allotment will be followed as mentioned in the GO (Ms) No. 167, Higher Education (J2) Department, dated 31.08.2021.

Candidates who are willing to apply for BTech (Food Technology), BTech (Poultry Technology) and BTech (Dairy Technology) can submit their online application through a single pooled BTech application.

While applying online, the candidates are requested to give their order of campus preference for BVSc & AH and course preference for BTech, which will be considered for Online counselling. After submission of application, the order of campus preference (BVSc & AH) / course preference (BTech) cannot be changed. Hence, the candidates are requested to opt their preference of campus / course carefully before submission.

There is **NO NEED TO SEND THE HARD COPY OF APPLICATION TO THE UNIVERSITY**. However, the candidates may take a printout of the application for future reference.

A **Specimen copy of Online application** form is available on the website for the candidates to understand this procedure and practice before online submission of their application (**Read the Instructions to the candidates as given in Page No. 31- 33**).

4.5.1 Normalization of Marks

As per Tamil Nadu Act No. 3 of 2007 dated 05.03.2007, the marks obtained by the students in the relevant subjects in the qualifying examination conducted by various Boards or Authorities shall be equated with the marks obtained by them in the same subjects in the qualifying examination conducted by the State Board of Tamil Nadu by adopting the method of normalization.

For example, if the highest mark secured by a student of the State Board of Tamil Nadu in Physics is 100% and the highest mark secured by a student of a Board other than Tamil Nadu State Board in the same subject is 90%, both the highest marks will be considered to be equal to 100%. If a student of the other Board secures 60 marks in Physics when the first mark in Physics in the same Board is 90, then the 60 marks of the Board will be considered to be equal to 66.67 marks of the Tamil Nadu State Board, as computed below:

$\frac{60}{90} \times 100 = 66.67\%$

After the normalization of marks in the relevant subjects in the qualifying examination conducted by the other Board, the qualified students of different Boards shall be ranked in a common merit list. The common merit list will be prepared for the total marks of 200.

4.5.2 Inter-se Merit

In cases, where more than one candidate has got the same mark in the common merit list, the *inter-se* merit among such candidates shall be determined as per G.O. Ms. No.73, Animal Husbandry, Dairying and Fisheries (AH6) Department, dated 24-05-2007 for the following degree programmes in the order of priority, as specified below:

4.6.1 In-person counseling

Counselling for the Special Categories (Sports quota, Children of Ex-Servicemen and Differently-abled) and 7.5 % Government School quota will be conducted prior to General Category counseling. The candidates have to appear IN PERSON along with the relevant original certificates at the venue specified by the University.

4.6.2 Online counseling

- Online Counselling will be conducted on the basis of order of merit, rules of reservation of Government of Tamil Nadu and preference opted by the candidate. The eligible candidates need to register for participation in online counselling.
- The selected candidates shall download their admission letter. They have to report to the mentioned venue within the prescribed time to submit their certificates /

documents for verification and pay the prescribed fee. Upon submission of necessary documents and payment of prescribed fee, the candidate will be admitted to the course and admission slip will be issued to the candidate and they shall report to the admitted colleges on the prescribed date of registration / orientation.

- The campus (for BVSc & AH) / course (for BTech) preference shall be made by the candidate only once for the counselling. The candidates who failed to register for online counselling WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED FOR ADMISSION THEREAFTER.
- Based on the vacancy position, next round of counselling will be conducted. Sliding procedure (internal counselling for campus / course change based on the rank and preference for the eligible candidates) will be followed for already admitted candidates. Further, for the resultant vacancies, candidates will be selected based on the counselling registration.

4.7.1 Fee Exemption for Students Admitted Under 7.5% Government School Quota As per the GO 221 Higher Education (J2) dated 15.11.2021, the State government will absorb the expenses for education in professional courses of students admitted under the 7.5%

reservation for government school students (as specified by the state Government). The fees for counseling, tuition and hostel, would be paid by the Government itself. They have to submit the proof for details of Government Schools in which studied from 6th Standard to 12th standard in Tamil Nadu.

4.7.2 First Graduate Tuition Fee Concession

In the G.O. (Ms) No. 85 Higher Education (J2) Department dated 16.04.2010, the Government has ordered to grant tuition fee concession to the candidates, who are to be the first graduate in a family. If the applicant's brother or sister has already availed First Graduate Tuition Fee Concession for studying Professional Courses, then the applicant is not eligible for such concession.

Candidates must have completed 12 years (10+2) of school education of Indian System or its equivalent. Candidates must have studied in English Medium and obtained a pass with good marks / grades as per their systems of education in Biology (or Zoology and Botany), Physics and Chemistry. It is a dedicated website for University admission and visa applications for foreign students who wish to pursue their higher education in Indian Higher Education Institutes (HEIs). With the launch of the portal, it is now mandatory for international students seeking admission in Indian HEIs to register on the SII portal for the academic session 2023-24 onwards for every full-time or short-term course. The portal provides a structured mechanism to facilitate foreign students to meet their visa obligations. A unique ID will be generated when a student register on the portal and this ID will have to be quoted with Visa applications.

6.3 Selection

Selection will be done based on the Academic Merit of the eligible candidates. Eligibility will be decided based on scrutinization of subjects studied and marks obtained in the concerned subjects. The selection list will be hosted on the University website.

6.4 Fees

OTHER INFORMATION

8. SYSTEM OF EDUCATION

8.1 BVSc & AH Degree Course

($4\frac{1}{2}$ years of course work and One year of internship as per MSVE Regulations, 2016)

The syllabus and regulations prescribed by the Veterinary Council of India (MSVE-2016) is adopted for BVSc & AH degree programme. An enrolled student should complete the course credits prescribed from time to time and shall have to earn a minimum Overall Grade Point Average (OGPA) of **5.0 out of 10.0** in order to earn BVSc & AH degree. After completion of course credits at the end of 4½ years, the student should satisfactorily complete an Internship Training Programme of one year duration.

8.2 BTech (Food Technology/ Poultry Technology / Dairy Technology)

Semester Course Credit System (8 Semesters)

The pattern of instruction and evaluation is the semester course credit system under the syllabus and regulations prescribed by the ICAR/TANUVAS. An enrolled student should complete the course credits prescribed from time to time and shall have to earn a minimum Overall Grade Point Average (OGPA) of **5.0 out of 10.0** in order to earn BTech (Food Technology) / BTech (Poultry Technology) / BTech (Dairy Technology) degree. The student shall satisfy the minimum residential requirement of 8 semesters of study including the compulsory in-plant training for one semester.

9. SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships such as SC / SCA / ST Welfare and Backward Class Scholarships, Scholarships given by Government of India, Government of Tamil Nadu and Indian Council of Agricultural Research, Pattukottai Azhagiri Endowment Scholarship, *Pudhumaipen Scheme* and scholarships from other agencies and financial assistance from Tamil Nadu Agricultural Labourers - Farmers (Social Security and Welfare) Scheme are available for the deserving candidates admitted under Tamil Nadu state quota. The scholarship may vary according to the degree/college to which the candidates are admitted and respective funding agencies.

The candidates should furnish copies of certificates (Annexure - V (a and b) as on Page Nos. 65 and 66) to the effect that he / she is the first graduate in his / her family from the appropriate authority along with the application. If the information furnished by him / her is found incorrect at a later stage, he / she will repay the entire amount spent on him / her by the Government, besides legal action being initiated against him / her.

9.1 Post Matric Scholarship

SC / SCA / ST students

In the G.O. (Ms.) No. 6 Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare (AD3) Department dated 09.01.2012; G.O. (Ms.) No. 92 Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare (AD3) Department dated 11.09.2012; and G.O. (Ms.) No. 16 Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare (AD3) Department dated 24.02.2014, the Government has ordered to grant Post Matric Scholarship to SC / SCA / ST candidates and SC / SCA converted Christians, whose parental annual income is **less than Rs. 2,50,000/-** from all the sources shall only be eligible. The eligible candidates have to submit income certificate obtained from the appropriate authorities.

BC / MBC / Minorities students

In the G.O. (Ms.) No. 68 BC, MBC & Minorities Welfare Department dated 18.11.2021, the Government has ordered to grant Post Matric Scholarship to BC / MBC / Minority candidates, whose parental annual income is **less than Rs. 2,50,000/-** from all the sources shall only be eligible. The eligible candidates have to submit income certificate obtained from the appropriate authorities.

10. HOSTEL FACILITIES

- a) Hostel facilities for the students are available in each campus and the messes function on a dividend system / contract basis.
- b) The students will be accommodated in the hostels to the extent possible, subject to availability.
- c) A sum of Rs. 5,000/- will be collected as caution deposit for hostellers.
- d) In addition, the lodging fee of Rs. 1000/- will be collected annually by the concerned hostel authorities.

11. PREVENTION OF RAGGING

Ragging is punishable as per Proceedings of the Supreme Court of India in SLP (C) No. 24295/2004 conveyed by the University Grants Commission, *vide* Letter No. F.1-8/2006 (Cpp-II) dated 04.03.2008. If any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authorities, the concerned student shall be directed to explain and if his / her explanation is not found satisfactory, the authority will expel him / her from the Institution.

12. REGISTRATION AFTER ADMISSION

- (i) A candidate who has been selected for admission to BVSc & AH / BTech (Food Technology) / BTech (Poultry Technology) / BTech (Dairy Technology) degree programme and paid the fees to secure the seat shall register for the requisite courses within seven working days from the date of commencement of registration for the first year, failing which his / her admission will stand cancelled automatically. Registration can be done without fine on the first two working days and with a fine of Rs.100/- on the remaining five working days.
- (ii) A candidate who has paid the fees but fails to register on the date specified or fails to inform his / her intention of not registering for the course, within one week from the date specified for registration, is liable to forfeit the fees paid by him / her.
- (iii) Agreement and Surety bond: Candidates selected for admission and his / her parent / guardian will have to execute an agreement bond during admission to college as prescribed in Annexure VI and VII as on Page No. 67 and 68. Failure to execute the Agreement bond will lead to cancellation of selection.
- (iv) Physical fitness: Candidates need to submit a physical fitness certificate (format prescribed by the university) from the Government Medical Officer not below the rank of Civil Surgeon at the time of registration. If the candidate is certified to be unfit to pursue the study by the Government Medical Officer, he / she will not be permitted to register on any ground.

13. MIGRATION AFTER CLOSURE OF ADMISSION

Apart from Internal counseling (sliding) during the admission process, campus migration/transfer within the college campuses of TANUVAS and from any other Universities is not permissible under any account/circumstances.

14. DISCONTINUANCE

14.1 Before registration

A candidate, who intends to withdraw from the degree programme before registration, is entitled to get a refund of 80% of the tuition fee and 100% of all the other fees paid by him / her, provided the claim for refund is made within one month from the date notified for registration / commencement of classes. Otherwise, he / she is liable to forfeit the full fees paid for the admission.

14.2 Before the closure of the admission

A student who desires to leave the degree programme after registering for the course and before the date of closure of admission, irrespective of the fact that he / she has attended the classes or not, is entitled to get a refund of 30% of the tuition fee and 50% of all the other fees except laboratory fund.

14.3 After the closure of the admission

A student who desires to leave the degree programme after the closure of BVSc & AH admission (as decided by the University) or on any date of subsequent years, irrespective of the fact, should pay a discontinuance fee of **Rs.3,00,000/-** (Rupees Three lakh only) as per the bond executed as penalty.

- 1. Candidates should carefully read the Prospectus before filling up the application form online. All rows / columns in the application should be correctly and completely filled in.
- 2. Candidates should submit applications online at https://adm.tanuvas.ac.in on or before 21.06.2024, 5.00 PM. ONLY ONLINE APPLICATION WILL BE ACCEPTED. OTHER FORMATS OF APPLICATION WILL SUMMARILY BE REJECTED.
- Candidates should apply for BVSc & AH and / or BTech (Food Technology / Poultry Technology / Dairy Technology) degree programmes through a single online application, provided they have paid the application/registration fees as detailed below, before applying.

4. If, for any reason (for want of more details), the candidate is not able to fill in all the required columns at a stretch, he / she may SAVE the application for future access. Upon saving the application, the candidate can Login by entering their e-mail / mobile number and password (One Time Password - OTP) for editing the contents later and submission before the due date.

- After filling in all the relevant columns in the application and uploading necessary documents / certificates, the candidates may recheck the details provided by them before submission through **PREVIEW**.
- 6. Candidates should ensure that the correct amount of ONLINE APPLICATION FEE is paid by using the method viz. a) Credit Card b) Debit Card c) Internet Banking d) IMPS and e) UPI in the ONLINE PAYMENT GATEWAY.

9. No addition, deletion or alteration of any particulars relating to the application is permitted after the final submission of the application.

10. The scanned copies of certificates/documents to be uploaded for online application are HSC / CBSE / other equivalent mark sheet, 11th mark sheet (if applicable), copy of Transfer Certificate, copy of Community Certificate, relevant Certificates for Special categories (if required) and copy of Nativity Certificate (if required).

11. Sports quota:

- a. The candidates of academic stream who wish to apply for BVSc & AH / BTech (Food Technology / Poultry Technology / Dairy Technology) degree programme under **sports quota** are requested to read the details and guidelines for sports quota (**Appendix – II as on Page No. 48**).
- b. They are requested to arrange the certificates year-wise (June 2020 to May 2021, June 2021 to May 2022, June 2022 to May 2023 and June 2023 to May 2024 as mentioned in Annexure III, Page No. 63) and scanned copy of the sports certificates and related documents / forms should be kept ready before filling the application.

- c. The candidates need to fill the relevant details of sports particulars and upload the relevant certificates year-wise.
- d. After filling sports particulars and uploading the certificates, the candidates shall view the summary of the sports particulars and Annexure III (List of certificates considered for each year with marks). Candidates may edit the particulars for any changes, if required.
- e. Mere filling and uploading of the sports certificates DOES NOT GUARANTEE for assignment of marks as claimed by the candidate. The marks for sports category will be assigned after scrutiny of their application and certificates / documents uploaded.

 - iv. Admission is subject to verification of mark certificates by the Director of Government Examinations and if the mark certificate is found to be fake, admission is liable for cancellation besides criminal action being taken.

14. **Community Certificate** is subject to verification by the District Vigilance Committee of the district concerned and if the community of the candidate is found to be untrue, admission is liable for cancellation besides criminal action being taken.

15. No correspondence will be entertained in any form.

Important Note

The contents in the application form and prospectus are subject to modification or revision that may be issued from time to time by the University and Government of Tamil Nadu.

16. DISPUTE REDRESSAL

With respect to the interpretation of the provisions of any matter not covered in this prospectus, the decision of the University shall be final and binding on all the parties concerned. Any complaints, grievances *etc.*, related to UG admissions and academic matters must be first referred to the Chairman, UG Admission Committee, Tamil Nadu Veterinary and Animal Sciences University, Chennai who will be the appellate authority with respect to such complaints / disputes. The Courts having their jurisdiction at Chennai alone can adjudicate on all matters and disputes related to admissions and academic matters. Further, any legal question arising out of the admission shall be entertained only when raised within 30 days from the declaration of the result. No disputes will be entertained after the closure of admission.

- 5. Players who participated in any of the Categories I, II and III in Table (I) should produce the copies of the following:

- i. VISA, Immigration entry in the passport, clearance from Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports (Government of India), Indian Olympic Association and respective National Sports Federations including BCCI.
- ii. The fixture, draw, schedule of events, players' accreditation, National Medal, Merit, Diploma, Participation certificate and Form-I issued by respective National Sports Federation and certificates signed and issued in the prescribed format by the President or Secretary General of the National Olympic Committee of the Organizing Country and International Federation.

4 (b) For National Tournaments

- The National tournaments should have been officially recognized as the regular annual championships / tournament by MYAS or IOA or SAI or SDAT or SGFI Nationals conducted every year by school education department in age groups (U-14, U-17, U-19) or respective Official National Sports Federation will be considered (for each year) for the award of marks.
- 2. Marks will not be awarded for selection trials and coaching camps.
- Tournaments conducted by the Federation which are not recognized by the IOA or MYAS, TNOA or SDAT at National Level for a particular period will not be considered for award of marks.
- 4. Candidates must have participated at Zonal / Cluster, District, Regional / State, National and International in a particular Game / Sport in the same hierarchical order as per the existing norms applicable for a particular Game / Sports.

4 (c) For State Tournaments

- The State Level Tournaments should officially be recognized as the regular annual championships or tournaments, by the respective Official State Association or SAI or SDAT or School Education Department of Tamil Nadu will be considered (for each year) for the award of marks.
- 2. Marks will not be awarded for selection trials and coaching camps.
- Any tournaments conducted by the Association which are de-recognized by the SDAT at the State Level for a particular period will not be considered for award of marks.

4 (d) For Tamil Nadu Board / CBSE / KV Schools / CISCE - Sports Achievements

1. Tamil Nadu Board Schools, KV / CISCE and CBSE schools, Zonal and Cluster level achievements will not be considered.

 The candidates participated in the tournaments conducted by CBSE and KV schools, at Regional / South zone are equated to Regional level achievements, and the National level achievements are equated to State level of State / Matric Board Schools.

5. GENERAL CONDITIONS

- For consideration of candidates seeking admission under the category of eminent sports person, he/she should attach all the attested photocopies of participation certificates and the relevant forms issued by the competent sports authorities, along with the application.
- 2. Participation / achievements in each academic year from 01.06.2020 to 31.05.2024 (01.06.2020 to 31.05.2021, 01.06.2021 to 31.05.2022, 01.06.2022 to 31.05.2023 and 01.06.2023 to 31.05.2024) in sports / games shown in the list alone will be considered for the award of marks. National or State Level Championships or Tournaments conducted by Sports Federations or Associations recognized by MYAS or IOA or SDAT or TNOA alone will be considered for marks (Recognition of State Associations / National Federations should be relevant to the year concerned).
- The relevant attested copies of certificates issued by the competent authorities as detailed below (Table VI) are to be submitted along with the application before the last date for submission of the applications.

- 4. Open or Invitational or Memorial or any indifferent nomenclature or title of tournaments or Championship at District or State or National or International level will not be considered for marks.
- 5. District or Inter–district Championship means the championship conducted by the respective recognized District or State Sports Association for a Revenue District or Revenue Districts in the State of Tamil Nadu.
- 6. Direct participation or achievement at any level without participating in the qualifying level competitions such as District or State or National or direct selection conducted by District or State Sports Association or National Sports Federation to represent the District or State or National or International tournaments or championships will not be considered for award of marks.
- 7. For international achievements in Tennis, marks for Gold, Silver and Bronze will be awarded to players who ranked first, second and third respectively in the ATP or WTA rankings of International Tennis Federation. For awarding participation marks for the top 5 ranked players will be considered from the ATP or WTA list published by the International Tennis Federation. Necessary document and proof should be enclosed by the candidate.

For National or State level achievement in Tennis, marks for Gold, Silver and Bronze will be awarded to players who ranked first, second and third respectively in the AITA

or TNTA at National or State. For awarding participation marks for the top 5 ranked players will be considered from the list published by AITA or TNTA at National or State level based on the ranking. Necessary document and proof should be enclosed by the candidate.

- 8. Certificates should be in printed form and necessary Form I and II should be in the prescribed format (Certificates or forms issued in letter pads will be invalid).
- 9. All other sport disciplines in which ranking is the criteria for assessment of achievement, rules indicated in item 7 above will be applicable for award of marks.
- 10. For Cricket, the annual official Championships or Tournaments conducted within the country under the auspices of TNCA or BCCI at District or State or National Level alone will be taken into consideration for that year.
- 11. Multiple events in a particular sport must be standardized events and in accordance with the events organized by the approved international Federations. Events newly created and not in accordance with the requirement will not be considered for award of marks.
- 12. The participation or achievements of candidates with nativity of Tamil Nadu who represented Tamil Nadu alone are eligible for marks under National Category.
- 13. Only Tamil Nadu candidates are eligible to apply for admission under Sports Quota and only the KVS and CBSE schools within Tamil Nadu are eligible for marks.
- 14. A Committee constituted by the University for this purpose will rank the candidates based on the marks assigned to the certificates enclosed along with the application. Candidates with a minimum sports mark of 5 and above alone will be considered for ranking.

- 21. Short-listed candidates will be called for Counselling based on their ranks and allotment of colleges earmarked for the Sports Quota based on the ranking before the start of main Counselling.
- 22. Candidates securing admissions under Eminent Sports Persons quota should sign an undertaking at the time of receiving allotment order, assuring participation in sports activities in the college preferred by them.
- 23. Legal action would be taken on parents and candidates for furnishing bogus documents under this Sports Quota. They should ensure that the certificates obtained are from competent authorities.
- 24. A CANDIDATE CAN UTILIZE THE SPORTS QUOTA ONLY ONCE.
- 25. Candidates applying for Sports Quota Category should verify and ensure the marks in **Annexure III (Page No.63 of the prospectus)**, before submitting the online application. Further, the marks are subject to change by the scrutiny committee based on the eligibility norms.


